



**Do you have a project that has improved resilience in your community?**

**If so, the 2009 Australian Safer Communities Awards may be the perfect way to promote and recognise your achievements in your own community and beyond.**

## **What are the Australian Safer Communities Awards?**

The Australian Safer Communities Awards are sponsored by Emergency Management Australia (EMA), a division of the Australian Government Attorney-General's Department, in conjunction with States and Territories.

They recognise best practice and innovation by organisations and individuals that have developed and successfully implemented an initiative which help to build safer communities across Australia.

The awards cover all aspects of community safety in the context of emergency management including:

- risk assessment
- research
- education and training
- information and knowledge management
- prevention, preparedness, response and recovery

The awards are judged on two levels (excluding the Federal agencies category) - State and Territory winners are decided and recognised first, and in turn become finalists for the National Awards

## **Award Categories**

There are seven categories based broadly on the type of organisation applying:

1. State agencies, including government-owned business enterprises
2. Local Government, single and collective subcategories
3. Volunteer organisations and community groups where membership is substantially voluntary
4. Private sector organisations
5. Education and training bodies, including vocational training, research, primary, secondary, TAFE or tertiary educational facilities
6. Not for profit organisations
7. Federal agencies, including government-owned business enterprises; or projects which are cross jurisdictional; or projects that are of national significance

NOTE: Entries in the final category are not judged at the State / Territory level. They are to be sent to the national coordinator (listed at the back of this brochure), for consideration by the national judging panel. Please contact the national coordinator if you are unsure if it is the most appropriate category for your project.

While there is no specific award for individuals, they may submit entries in any appropriate category.

## What sort of projects can be nominated?

## Who are the awards for and who can enter?

Any organisation or individual can enter. Individuals who do enter on behalf of their organisation are required to ensure the entry is made with the endorsement of the organisation's senior authorised officer, such as Chief Executive Officer.

If you're aware of a good project, you can nominate the organisation for an award.

Safer Communities Award winners are recognised throughout the emergency management sector for their outstanding achievement, innovation and professional standing.

State and Territory winners will receive an award and a certificate at a special ceremony.

National award recipients will be sponsored to travel to Canberra to receive their award and certificate. The National Awards will be presented by the Attorney-General at a ceremony in Canberra, later in 2009. Press releases and a commemorative booklet will also be issued.

Winners at the State / Territory level and national award recipients may use the appropriate Australian Safer Communities Awards logo in their letterhead and promotional material.

## Time Frame

The entries in the 2009 Awards must:

- relate to projects commenced in 2008 or 2009, or
- relate to existing projects with significant outcomes since January 2008, or
- relate to existing projects with significant enhancements since January 2008.

## Judging

A panel of judges organised by the appropriate peak emergency management bodies will judge State and Territory entries.

State and Territory winners will then be judged for the National Awards by an expert panel appointed by the Director General, EMA.

## Judging Criteria

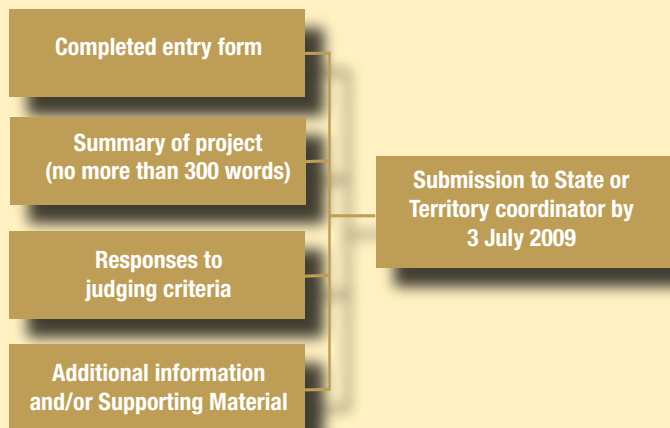
Each entry will be assessed on its contribution to community safety in the emergency management environment.

The State/Territory and national panels will assess answers to each entry's achievement against these criteria:

1. What identified need triggered the project?
2. What are the benefits of the project?
3. What evidence is provided that the project has improved safety in your community (for example, an evaluation of the project)?
4. To what extent were representatives of the community engaged in the development of this project?
5. What aspects of the project could be adapted or adopted for national applicability?
6. Is the project special or innovative in your community?
7. Does the project raise awareness of emergencies in your community?

## Frequently Asked Questions

### **Is there a ceremony for State recipients?**

Yes, each of the States and Territories acknowledges the winning and highly commended entrants by hosting a ceremony. The ceremony usually takes place in late September to early October. Please contact your State / Territory coordinator for more information.

### **What happens after the State awards?**

The winning entries from each of the States and Territories are forwarded to the national coordinator in readiness for national judging. The national judging panel is convened and judges the merits of each entry in the seven different categories. The judging panel selects a winner and highly commended for each category, or may at its discretion, select more than one winner and / or highly commended per category or choose not to select any.

The national winners and highly commended are then invited to attend a presentation ceremony held in Canberra later in 2009.

### **How will I know if I've won?**

State and Territory coordinators will contact winners and highly commended entrants following State / Territory judging. Similarly, the national coordinator will contact national award recipients by letter following national judging.

### **Who is a national award recipient?**

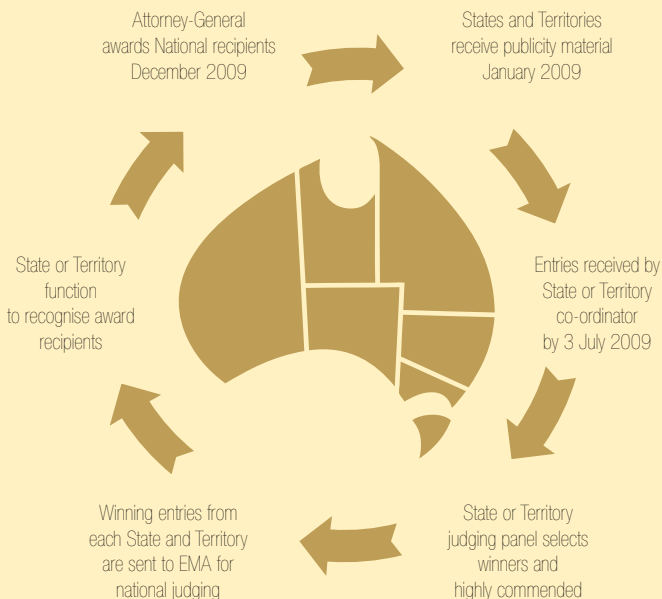
Winners and highly commended entries at the national level are national award recipients.

### **If I enter, do I get a trip to Canberra?**

Only the national award recipient's expenses are covered by EMA. However, all 2009 entrants are welcome to attend. Please contact the national coordinator on 03 5421 5296 or 0408 978 238 to request an invitation.

### **What if this is a joint project between two or more organisations?**

Many of the entries received in the past have been joint or combined projects. In most cases one organisation has the lead role and the category applicable to that organisation is where the entry needs to be submitted. Please ensure that all organisations are listed on the entry form and that endorsement by each organisation's senior authorising officer has been obtained.
